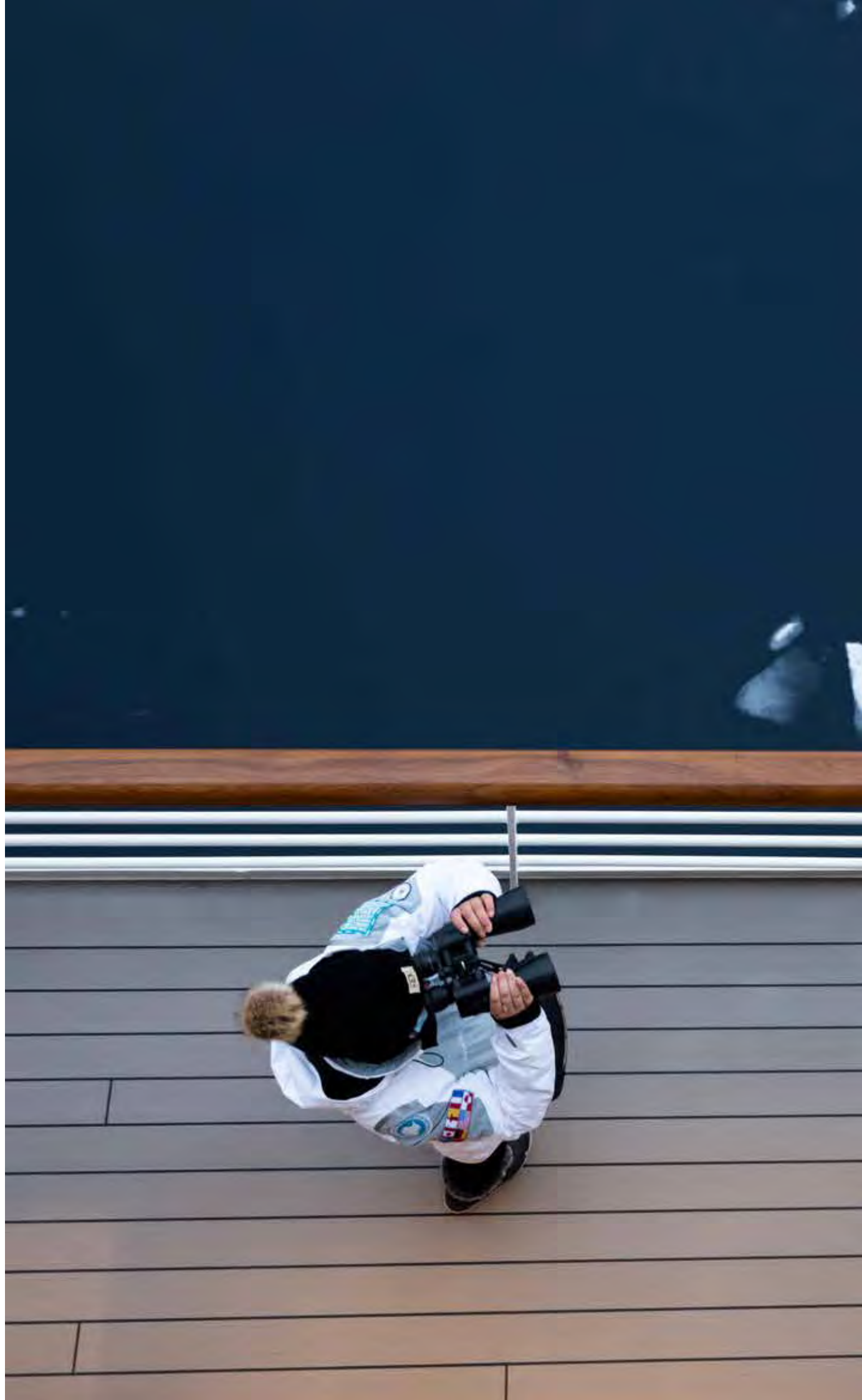

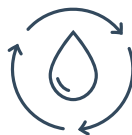

Before the marketing of each new route, our experts go there to study the environments we will visit and meet the people who live there.

We make every effort to take into account the cultural heritage of the areas visited. Dialogue with local communities about the planning of excursions makes it possible to choose the aspects they wish to share with guests. We encourage traditional know-how and craftsmanship and prefer to use local products and services. All our landings are subject to a rigorous protocol. This innovative approach involves a dedicated team that ensures there is no impact on the ecosystem visited.



## The PONANT Foundation

By booking your cruise, you are supporting the PONANT Foundation. It was created to support projects whose objective is to contribute to the preservation of the oceans, to support the acquisition of scientific knowledge on the polar environment and to promote interactions between peoples and cultures. Today, by supporting various associations, the Foundation is contributing

in particular to the construction of a school in the Bijagos archipelago; to the preservation of coral in New Caledonia; to the study of humpback whales in the southern hemisphere, and to the fight against plastic pollution in the oceans.

For several years, we have actively supported Le Cercle Polaire®, a think tank that works to promote the preservation of the polar environments. Personalities from *L'Appel des Pôles* and members of the NGO *Cercle Polaire* thus regularly participate in our polar cruises.



We are a member of International Association of Antarctic Tour Operators (IAATO), and Association of Arctic Expedition Cruise Operators (AECO). As such, we comply with strict rules concerning the number of guests authorised to disembark, the distance from wildlife, the training of our expedition teams, and even emergency and medical evacuation plans.



## Recognised commitment

Our commitment is regularly praised by various reference organisations.

- **All our vessels are Clean Ship and Clean Ship Super certified**, the highest certifications awarded by Bureau Veritas.
- The German NGO NABU awarded us the title of **the most environmentally friendly cruise company**.
- PONANT is the first European cruise line to obtain the **North American Green Alliance certificate**. It attests to the adoption of environmentally friendly practices and technologies by its members.
- We also received the **Palmes du Tourisme durable prize**, 'Travel' category for the total elimination of heavy fuel oil in favour of low sulphur marine diesel (LSMGO).



# Sail with confidence

From the start of the health crisis, we have reinforced our protocol and implemented a process to reassure guests before, during and after the cruise. Rigorous and proven, it is constantly updated based on recommendations from public authorities.



## Compliance with regulations

Each country determines its own regulations for access across its borders. As these regulations do change, we shall inform you of the necessary formalities to ensure you are permitted to enter all countries on your cruise schedule and to 'have access them on board'. We also comply rigorously with all local regulations to ensure we are allowed to operate.

We also take into account the protocols issued by international health authorities: the WHO, the CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) and the French Ministry of Health as well as the the CLIA (Cruise Line International Association).

## Your safety on board

Since the beginning of the health crisis, we have implemented best practice on board to maintain the safety of our passengers and crew members. These actions include social distancing, the wearing of masks, the disinfection of common areas and cabins, the monitoring of temperatures and air exchange. In all situations, our goal is to exceed the industry standards.

As the health situation continues to evolve, we may have to adapt our onboard protocols to ensure we maintain best practice.



## Increased vigilance

The company's medical department keeps careful track of the health situation in the destination countries. A doctor and a nurse are always present on all our ships, throughout the duration of the cruise. They accompany you on excursions and can be contacted 24 hours a day. They have access to our on-board hospitals, equipped with the latest technology, for any small operations or to conduct tests in case of concern.

Whether brand new like our extreme polar exploration ship *Le Commandant Charcot*, or vintage, like the company's iconic yacht *Le Ponant* (which has taken to sea again in 2022 after two years of work), they have all benefited from a recent renovation and refitting. Each ship is ISM certified (International Safety Management), which is a very strict international regulation.

Bureau Veritas regularly certifies the entire PONANT fleet and has, in particular, validated the sanitary protocol implemented by the Company.

# The Arctic & The American Far North

After the long winter, these lands partly shed their coat of ice and metamorphose in the summer season.

# Not to be missed

The Arctic regions undergo incredible transformations as the summer solstice approaches.

The sun gradually emerges from its hiding place, creating seemingly endless sunsets displaying spectacular shapes and colours. The abundant wildlife becomes more active and may sometimes be seen and observed. The raw beauty of these lands bursts forth in all its splendour, presenting itself in the form of myriad landscapes bedecked in thousands of colours.



## Arctic hospitality

Few cultures in the world attract as much interest and fascination as the indigenous inhabitants of the polar regions. The 40 or so different ethnic groups making them up, such as the Inuit, the Sámi, the Aleuts, the Tlingit and the Yupiks, are fragments of a mosaic of vast and diverse cultures that have existed for thousands of years in extreme isolation. Though now connected to the latest technologies, they nevertheless strive to keep their traditional cultures alive. Having the chance to meet these indigenous peoples is an exceptional opportunity. With hospitality forming part of their customs, they are very welcoming, and willing to share their traditions, their craft techniques and some of the words and chants found in their native languages. Meeting these peoples also provides an opportunity to observe the close links they maintain with the land through fishing, hunting and reindeer herding.

## The thousand different facets of the Arctic Circle

To sail through this region of the world is to experience a voyage of prodigious proportions. There is an incredibly rich variety of landscapes and scenery to admire. Here, a majestic dazzling iceberg rising up in the middle of a sea of ice displaying thousands of shades of white and blue. There, a vertiginous fjord coming into view, encircled by steep cliffs of dark basalt. Further in the distance, a sparkling river snaking its way through a wide glacial valley. And over there, wild tundra covered in a luxurious blanket of softly coloured lichens, mosses and grasses. Whether on foot, in snowshoes, from a zodiac inflatable, or on board the ship, exploring the Arctic Circle is an experience of continual amazement.

## Hide-and-seek in the Far North

It is of course his majesty the polar bear who reigns supreme in the Far North. His kingdom, however, is also populated with walrus, whales, narwhals, seals, Svalbard reindeer, sea otters, small rorquals, Arctic foxes and around 300 species of birds. Nonetheless, you need to arm yourself with patience and keep your eyes peeled to spot and discover this fascinating wildlife; because the reason it's able to survive in one of the most hostile environments in the world is basically because it's learned to make it its own and blend in with it. The ship's onboard naturalists know what signs and indications to look for and can find out where these creatures – expert hide-and-seek players that they are – are located, thus guiding the wildlife watching experience. A unique quest for no less unique discoveries.

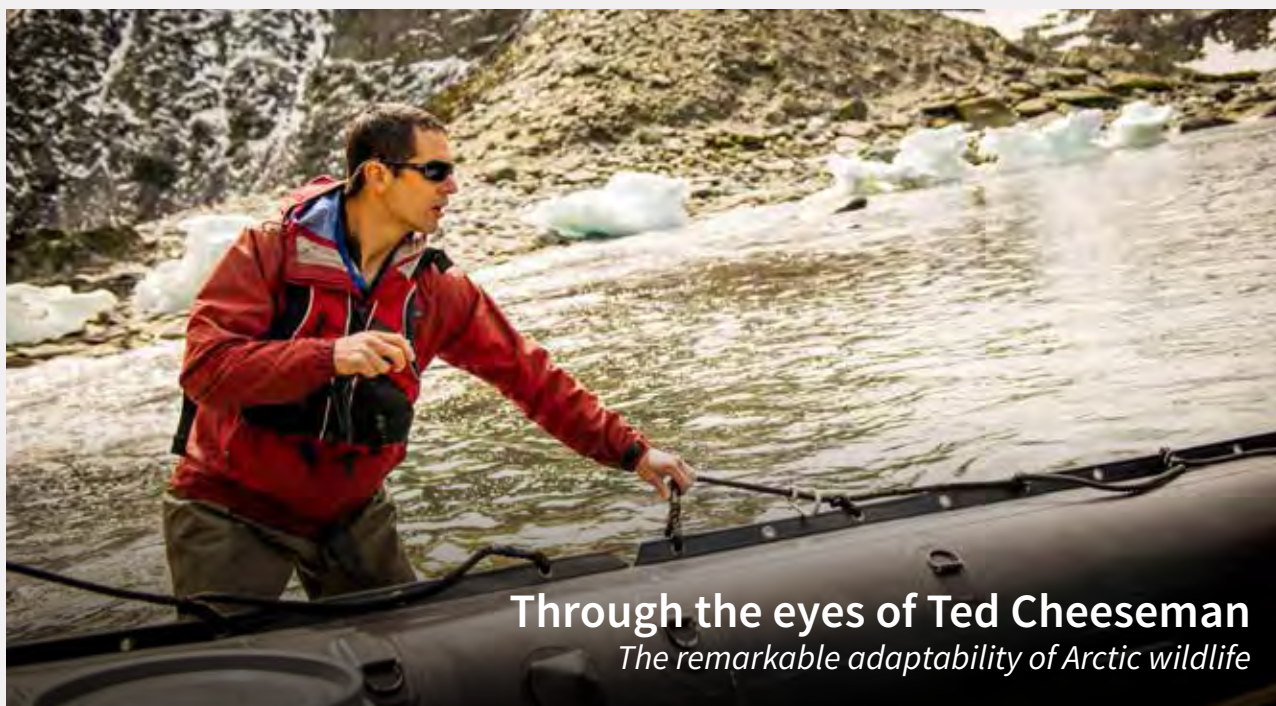

## *Things to see, do and experience*

- ✓ **The narwhal, or 'unicorn of the sea'**, which can be seen only in the waters of the Arctic. The males of the species are adorned with a tusk, which can grow to more than three metres in length in some cases.
- ✓ **The islands of Saint Pierre and Miquelon**, the last remaining vestiges of New France, the only French territory in America.
- ✓ **The sail amongst the icebergs in Tsaa fjord**, from where there are views of Guyot Glacier; or in Icy Bay in Alaska, as both time and the succession of landscapes pass gently by.
- ✓ **The last remaining hunters of the North Pole** in the Baffin Sea in Greenland, who continue to keep the Inuit's ancient traditions alive.
- ✓ **The sculptures of the indigenous peoples of the Far North**, who create veritable works of art with their ivory and wood engraving techniques.
- ✓ **The chiselled coast of Spitzbergen**, the last island before the North Pole, where there are remains of ancient whaling ships to be seen.
- ✓ **The world's tallest totem pole** (measuring 60 metres high), located in the Tlingit village of Kake on the northern part of America's west coast.

# Ports of call and places to explore



**Through the eyes of Ted Cheeseman**  
*The remarkable adaptability of Arctic wildlife*

Ocean biologist at the Sorbonne Marine Ecology Research Center, Ted Cheeseman has been travelling, guiding and studying in the Arctic for almost 10 years. In 2015, he founded *Happywhale*, a participatory research tool dedicated to the study of whales.

"My PhD work on humpback whales has me studying Arctic waters as whale populations are still responding to 20th century industrial whaling and climate change is causing the retreat of sea ice changing habitats. Arctic marine fauna is unique because at such high latitudes species have evolved to deal with the most seasonal environment on the planet. There is, high above the Arctic circle, one day and one night per year. Animals must therefore migrate or learn to live with the extreme polar night, creating remarkable adaptations. When in the Arctic I like to think of the explorers, hunters,

sealers and whalers who came into these waters in the 1600s — and of indigenous peoples who made homes at extreme latitudes from thousands of years ago... We travel in great comfort with our down and tech clothing compared to those who came before us! By bringing teams of experienced naturalist guides on board (even a science platform aboard *Le Commandant Charcot*), PONANT voyages give guests a unique access to a depth of experience and learning that very much complements an adventure into extreme latitudes."

## Iceland, land of fire and ice

In this wild, untamed land, one of the most volcanic in the world, and which has just two inhabitants per square kilometre, time seems to be standing still. The Icelanders call it "the country of the creation of the world". The landscapes of water, ice, lava, black sand and rocks are barely troubled by the presence of sheep and wild horses. The nature has a raw and powerful beauty. Behind this imposing glacier, the biting wind blows with all its force. Close to the spectacular waterfalls, nothing can stop the roar of the wild, tumbling water. The hot water springs, for their part, offer the unique spectacle of geysers in action. All around you, in every direction, there is a strong sense of freedom.







## In the footsteps of Erik the Red

More than 1,000 years ago, Erik the Red, banished from his Icelandic homeland and forced to seek exile, landed in the south of Greenland. He there discovered a land of welcoming landscapes of fjords and green, fertile valleys, and named it Greenland. It was then summer in this region constituted of the largest network of fjords in the world – Scoresby Sound. Over the course of this short season, just as a thousand years ago, nature reveals a finery impossible to imagine at the heart of summer: the mountains become green, the meltwaters and the waters of the waterfalls join together, the flowers bloom, the animals come out to play, the birds criss-cross the skies in all directions, and the seas come alive with breaching whales and leaping fish.



## The secrets of the Baffin Sea

A place at the very limits of extreme lands, where the sea ice briefly fragments over the space of a short summer; a place of ice deserts, virgin lands from the first dawns of the world, and the vast immensities of the polar ocean: welcome to the Baffin Sea. Take the time to look and observe. You will discover the hidden part of a preserved treasure: polar bears, humpback whales, seals and migrating birds have all chosen to make this their home. We offer several excursions by zodiac inflatable boat, giving you the opportunity to immerse yourself in the heart of this unique scenery and observe this exceptional wildlife.



## The immensity of the Great Lakes

It needed the melting of glaciers 14,500 years ago to form the Great Lakes of North America as we know them today. Straddling both the United States and Canada, these giant inland seas make up the world's largest group of freshwater lakes and account for 20% of all the planet's fresh water. There is a myriad of breathtaking sights to see when sailing lakes Ontario, Erie, Huron and Michigan, and the St. Lawrence Seaway. Amongst the must-see places to visit of the North American and Canadian landscapes are the UNESCO-inscribed Georgian Bay Littoral Biosphere Reserve and the famous Niagara Falls.



## The art of the totem pole on the west coast

We usually associate totem poles with Native American culture. This is an inaccurate generalisation however. These poles carved from large cedars and painted in vivid colours (and subsequently displaced to museums and national parks from their original locations by Europeans) are part of the traditional culture of the indigenous peoples of the northern part of the west coast. Totem poles recount the beliefs and familial and cultural ancestry of a nation, a family or an individual. Carrying depictions of people, animals or supernatural beings, they are usually placed facing river banks or the ocean, as attested by the poles at Sitka National Historical Park in Alaska, which are the work of Tlingit Indians.

## Grundarfjörður

This secret boreal hideaway is located at the foot of the Kirkjufell, on Snæfellsnes peninsula. Arriving by boat means you get an up-close view of the lava-stone rock standing like a sentinel at the entrance to the bay; Grundarfjörður lies sheltered behind this cone-shaped rock. A stone's throw from the jetty, crystal-clear waters, tundra and beaches give into the cerulean waters of Breiðafjörður. Scattered with its emerald-coloured lawns, this town, with its buildings that merge into the surrounding countryside, will most certainly win your favour. Three excursions are available in this stopover: a journey through the several small fishing villages and the volcanic landscapes of the Snæfellsnes peninsula; a tour among caves, craters and coves; finally, a walk at the foot of the Snæfellsjökull. The latter, a common link between all these excursions, is one of the most famous volcanos of Iceland: one of its craters is home to the passage leading to the depths of the planet in Jules Verne's novel *Journey to the Centre of the Earth*.

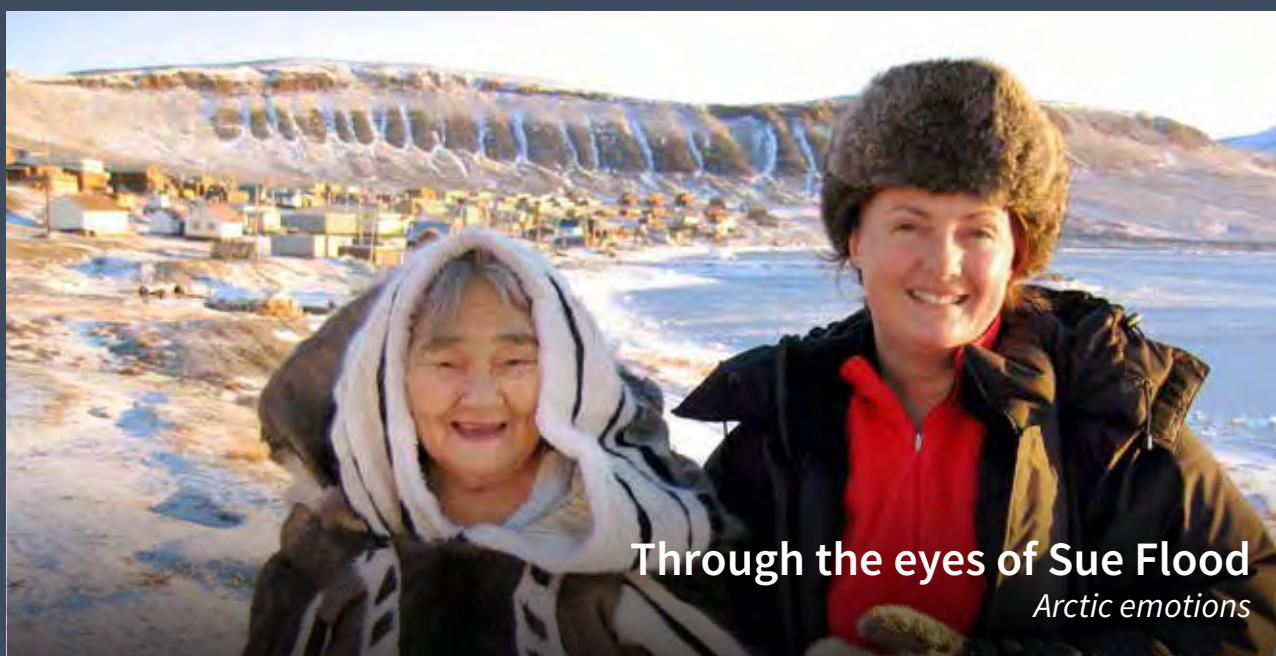

**Through the eyes of Sue Flood**  
*Arctic emotions*

Sue Flood originally trained as a Zoologist, before joining the BBC Natural History Unit as a wildlife filmmaker. She changed direction to become a professional photographer and has been working in the Arctic and Antarctic for over 25 years. This has included many trips to the Arctic – filming and photographing polar bears, belugas, narwhals, bowhead whales and other Arctic wildlife alongside the Inuit. She is now a PONANT Photo Ambassador.

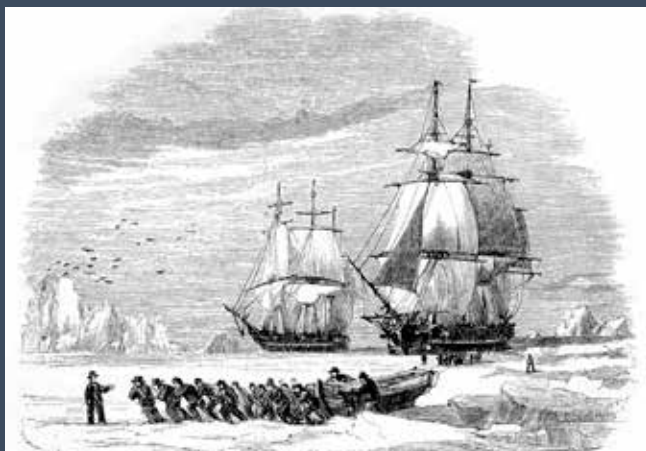
“The Arctic has a special place in my heart due to the incredible wildlife, spectacular landscapes and wonderful people. I have had the privilege of spending a lot of time with the Inuit of the Canadian High Arctic, and made a film about Inuit traditional knowledge. So I love to return whenever I can. I feel honoured to travel to such a remote wilderness and experience the majestic nature found here! There is nowhere like it! My adventures in the Arctic have included camping on the sea ice with Inuit hunters, swimming with narwhals and belugas at the floe edge in Nunavut, and eight trips to the North Pole. The sights and sounds are captivating and stay with you forever. Listening to the sea ice creaking beneath you, or

travelling in a zodiac along the edge of a glacier and listening to the bubbles of air as they are released from the brash ice is magical. For me, to see a polar bear hunting for ringed seals, or a mother playing with her young cub, is a very moving experience. The Inuit have a special word – *ilira* – for the feeling of excitement you experience when you see a polar bear. People make the mistake of thinking that ice is white, but you can see so many different colours – blue, turquoise, green. I like to try to capture the stunning light, sense of scale and hopefully a special moment – whether wildlife, scenery or people. Perhaps all three!”



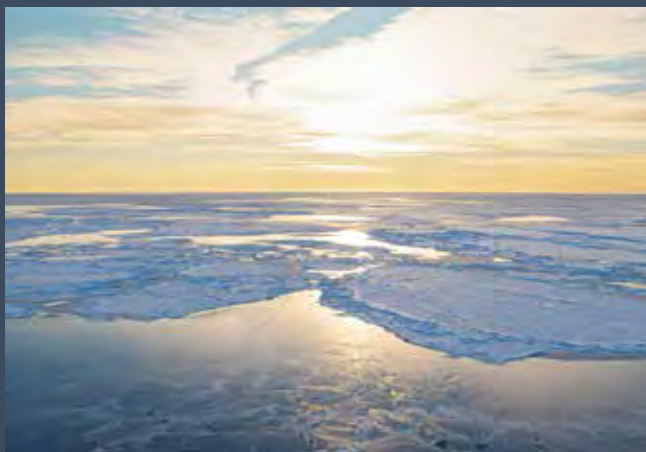
## Polar immersion

The activities offered on board *Le Commandant Charcot* promise a completely immersive experience, a voyage back in time to ancient traditions, such as an excursion by kayak, a boat invented by the Inuit around 4,000 years ago as a way of getting around and hunting and fishing. Ice fishing trips are another Inuit tradition conducive to meditation and quiet contemplation. You need to arm yourself with plenty of patience to have any hope of catching an Arctic grayling. An ancient practice, snowshoe hiking offers an experience filled with a sense of freedom and fulfilment, especially when it enables you to reach areas where human beings have rarely set foot. Finally, the polar plunge (wearing ordinary swimming costumes) and the drysuit swim promise adventures of an invigorating and ultra-sensory kind.



## Follow in the path of the polar explorers

Since the Greek Pytheas left Marseille in 330 BC and arrived at the boundaries of the known world, probably Iceland, followed in around 1,000 AD by the longboats of the intrepid Vikings, the ice continent has been a major magnet for explorers, the final frontier... Barents, Baffin, Bering, many would beat a path through these unknown lands that bear their names today. It was not until the beginning of the 20th century that Amundsen would finally cross the Northwest Passage (in 1906) and fly over the Geographic North Pole (in 1926). Aboard *Le Commandant Charcot*, the figures of these legendary explorers are present in every moment. In their wake lie infinite possibilities for an extraordinary adventure.



## A voyage to the ephemeral

Sheets of sea ice and pressure ridges sometimes several metres high, ice-free channels and nilas, fine layers of solid seawater... Before reaching the North Pole, the most northerly point on the planet, you first have to make your way through the meanderings of the Arctic Ocean. Many are the explorers who've dedicated their lives to discovering it. Reaching it, even today, is still a rare and moving privilege. The opportunity is ephemeral by definition, with the sea ice stretching as far as the eye can see and, like its occupants (gulls, fulmars, seals and sometimes even polar bears), in a state of constant motion. An experience as transient as it is memorable.



## Inuit springtime traditions

In early spring, the Inuit live by the rhythm of the pack ice. After the long months of the Arctic winter's polar night – a time of rest for them – daylight returns. During this period, the ice and pack ice have not yet gone. It becomes a space for interaction, a 'village square' of conviviality for the communities who live here. This is the time for taking out their dog sleds, tracking bears with dogs and hunting seals, just the way their ancestors always did: dressed in white, crawling over the ice pack, hidden behind a wooden frame covered with a white sheet. By showing you this way of life and having you take part in some of their activities, PONANT offers you genuine interaction with this culture.

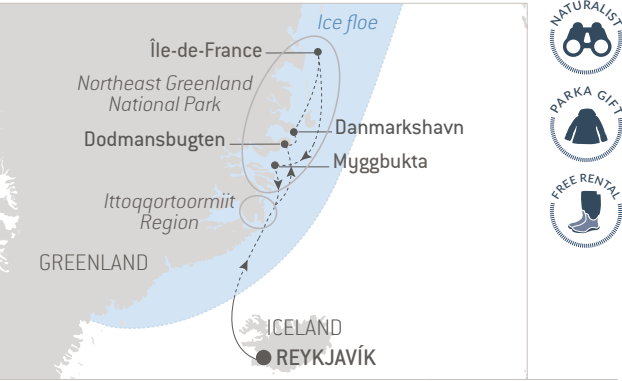

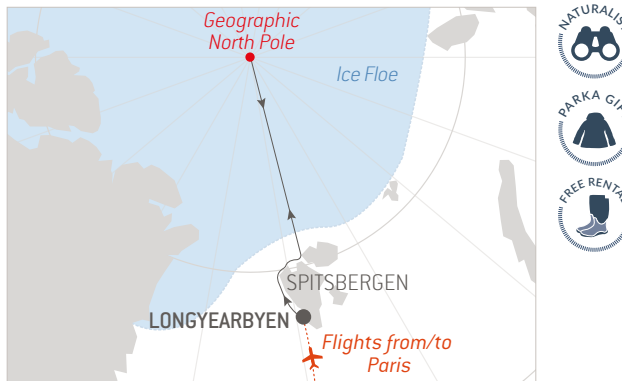

## Scoresby Sound

Covering an area of 13,700 km<sup>2</sup> (5,290 mi<sup>2</sup>), Scoresby Sound is the largest and deepest fjord system in the world. Named after the explorer and whale hunter William Scoresby, who mapped the region in 1822, it opens onto the Greenland Sea to the north of the Blossville Coast. 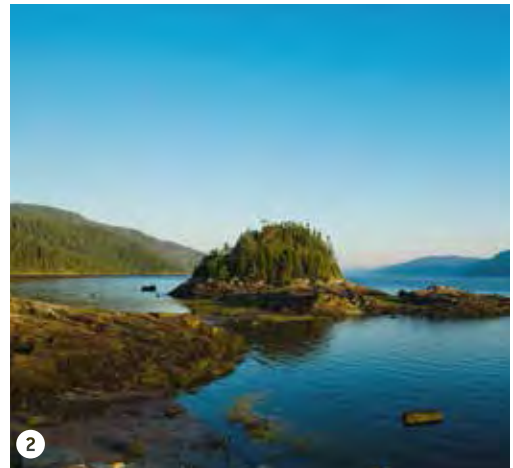

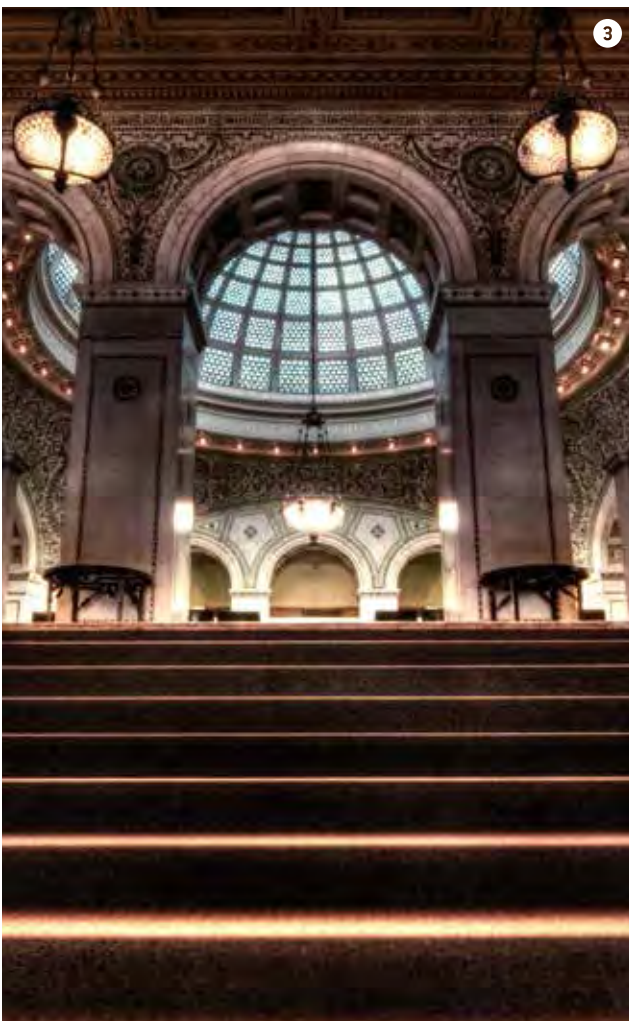
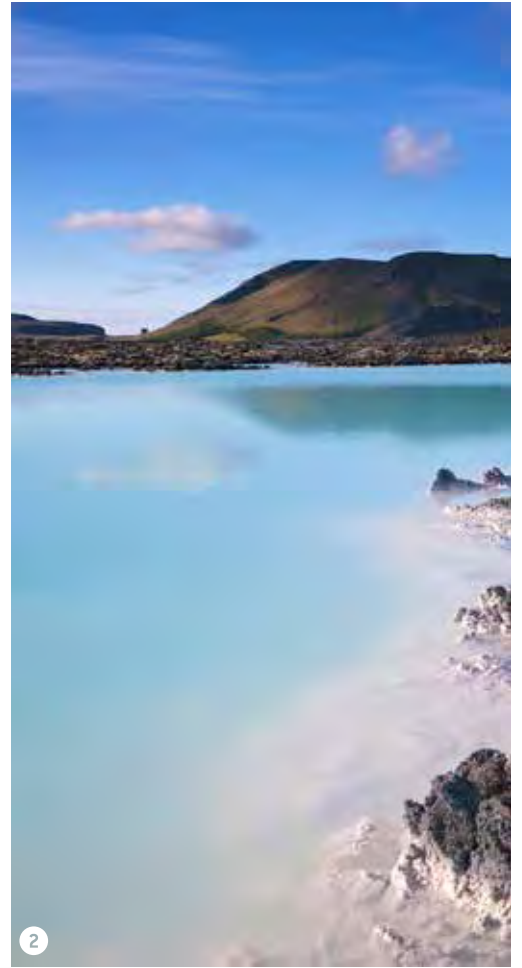

# *Northern Europe & the Atlantic*

The turbulence of the Atlantic Ocean; the wild, untamed expanses; the astonishing diversity of the landscapes and scenery: the Old Continent has a wealth of riches to offer.



# Not to be missed

Fjords, glaciers, green heaths and moors, wild coasts, volcanic islands: Europe is a multifaceted land of scenic delights. These vast spaces, historic cradles of the Napoleonic saga, the Celtic legends and the Vikings, have much to offer in the way of discovery and emotions, both for the eyes and the mind.



## Northern Europe, nature in its purest state

At the very north of Europe, the icy thrill of the polar world is tangibly present and there to be felt. Peacefully tranquil, the snow-covered island of Spitsbergen gives a foretaste of Greenland's landscapes. Close by lies mainland Norway with its dizzyingly steep and almost supernatural fjords. The Norwegians say that the stunning spectacle this provides is something everyone should see at least once in their lifetime. The verdant green hills of Ireland and Scotland are teeming with Celtic secrets and legends as old as the world itself. In Brittany, the waves of the sea break and crash on the cliffs of a rocky coastline. And further south, the Azores archipelago and its volcanic beaches add a sublime finishing touch to the diversity of Europe's landscapes.

## The towns and cities of the Baltic: the memory of Europe

With their richly flavoured blend of Germanic and Soviet heritage, the towns and cities of the Baltic are veritable capitals of culture. The Baltic coastal cities of Riga and Tallinn, with their mazes of little cobbled streets, offer a disparate collection of medieval architectural styles combined with an astonishingly cool and trendy party atmosphere, as exemplified by the Bohemian district of Kalamaja. In Scandinavia, you will explore the main UNESCO-listed cities of the Hanseatic League, visiting walled towns, ancient warehouses and merchants' houses at places such as Visby, on the Swedish island of Gotland, and Lübeck in Germany. These Baltic cities have managed to preserve their historic traditions whilst at the same time looking to the future through the use of new technologies.

## Exploring Celtic legends

The green landscapes of Ireland, Scotland and Brittany, France, bastions of the Celts, evoke the enchanted imaginary world of fairytales. From the Giant's Causeway and the forest of Brocéliande to the Highlands of Scotland or Queen Maeve's Grave, plains, hills and steep-cliffed islands simply invite the visitor to walk in the traces of ancient peoples. A building of natural grey stone with arrow slits suggests ancient battles waged in suits of armour. Iona Abbey and Nunnery, built in 563 as a centre of Celtic Christianity, still stands today. A voyage to the heart of Celtic lands replete with epic legends.





## *Things to see, do and experience*

- ✓ **The world's longest wooden staircase** in Lysefjord at Flørli: 4,444 steps leading up to a maximum height of 740 metres.
- ✓ **The high-gabled merchants' houses**, with their colourful façades, in Riga, Travemünde and Gdańsk: symbols of the cultural heritage of the Hanseatic League.
- ✓ **The walled town of Visby**, Scandinavia's very first fortified settlement and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- ✓ **The Giant's Causeway**, a site associated with popular Celtic legends and to which Belfast serves as the gateway.
- ✓ **Tallinn, one of the best preserved medieval cities in Europe**, with 1.9 kilometres of battlements and 23 towers.
- ✓ **The walls of the corsair city of Saint-Malo**, which looks out over the sometimes grey, sometimes turquoise waters of the changing tides.
- ✓ **Los Organos at La Gomera** in the Canary Islands, a remarkable natural basalt formation that now serves as a symbol of the island.
- ✓ **Vizcaya Bridge** in Spain, a remarkable construction dating from the Industrial Revolution, and the first bridge in the world to be inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



# Ports of call and places to explore



**Through the eyes of  
Franck Ferrand**  
*Atlantic exiles*

A writer and radio and television presenter with a passion for history, Franck Ferrand is a guest of honour and lecturer on board PONANT Northern Europe and Atlantic cruises. Using the example of Napoleon exiled to Saint Helena, he shares with us his personal view of the association between islands and exile.

"There are various examples of famous people who experienced exile in the islands of the Atlantic in recent centuries. In the 19th century, the novelist Almeida Garrett was exiled to the Azores for his liberal ideas; and around a century later, the last Austro-Hungarian emperor, Charles I, twice deposed, found himself in exile on the Portuguese island of Madeira with his family. During the same epoch, the Spanish regime of Primo de Rivera exiled the writer Miguel de Unamuno to the Canaries. The case of Napoleon I is the most severe, however, as he knew from 1818 onwards that he would never leave his island alive. The mysteries surrounding the causes of the emperor's death and the repatriation of his ashes stem, for many, from the very separation and remoteness involved. Moreover, the type of long martyrdom inflicted on this political and strategic giant went on to contribute considerably to his legend.

"Islands, especially the oceanic ones, symbolise a cutting off from the world, a remoteness and separation. They offer the advantage of control and security to regimes seeking to keep a well-known figure at a distance and prevent them escaping. The beauty of the location, the tranquillity of the surroundings, the potentially gentle way of life an island offers are all undoubtedly advantages for passing tourists and holidaymakers, or for residents who have chosen their own destiny. But the isolation of an island, for an exiled person, is an unrelenting cause of moral suffering. No exile is pleasant – the very word itself contains a sacrificial dimension. However, it is certain that in the case of Victor Hugo, for example, that expatriation did not involve the idea of house arrest. Napoleon III even invited him to return to France on several occasions, in vain."

## The icy beauty of Geiranger Fjord

One of the must-see places to visit in Norway, Geiranger is stunningly beautiful and has been listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2005. Lying tucked away off one of the branches of the Storfjord, it extends for more than 100 kilometres in total. What makes this majestic place so famous are its sheer cliffs, its waterfalls – such as The Seven Sisters and The Suitor – and its dark rocks. Intrepid ramblers can access panoramic views of the entire site via the winding Eagle Road at the edge of the fjords. The little town of just 250 inhabitants and its hillside farms offer the perfect setting in which to fully enjoy the charm of the area and savour local sweet specialities.





## Olden and the last of the ice giants

Little houses, red and white wooden churches, and breathtaking views of the mouth of the Oldeelva river: Olden is a modest village set amongst Norway's most celebrated picture-postcard scenery. Jostedalsbreen National Park, just a few kilometres away, is home to Europe's largest glacier. The emerald coloured lakes along the trail leading to the blue-tinged tongues of the Briksdalsbreen glacier are bordered by immense mountains, creating a perfect contrast between the softness of the water and the starkness of the fjords. The sight of an environment fashioned over the ages is enough to make one feel both humble and minuscule.



## Meditation and contemplation on Iona

Of all the islands making up the Inner Hebrides, Iona is by far the most conducive to relaxation and the pleasure of simply enjoying and making the most of each moment. Accessible only from the sea, it feels a timeless place. Though you don't expect it, the island actually has small white sandy beaches, turquoise seas and the green and verdant vegetation typical of Scotland. A sacred Celtic land rich in history, it's here that Saint Columba landed in around 563, when he came to spread Christianity to Scotland. Iona Abbey, with its Celtic cross dating from the era in question, today stands looking out over the landscape from atop its hill, occupying the site of the ancient monastery founded by the missionary.



## The opulent merchants' houses of Visby

Visby is a former Hanseatic city located on the west coast of Gotland, a Swedish island in the Baltic Sea. Within its walls, the old town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, has opulent merchants' houses and charming little streets lined with small wooden houses. Saint Mary's cathedral, with its bulb-topped towers, and the Gunpowder Tower, which forms part of the town walls, are some of the town's major landmarks. A stop for a break at one of the cafés festooned with roses, the city's symbolic flower, to sample the island's local speciality, red berry pancakes flavoured with saffron, is an unmissable experience.



## The volcanic sanctuary of the Azores

This string of volcanic islands sitting out in the North Atlantic has wild and unspoiled landscapes to explore and a range of ancient European colonial heritage to discover. A delightful place of exposed rock, black sandy beaches and basalt cliffs, the Azores testify to the strategic maritime position Portugal once held. The port of Ponta Delgada on São Miguel, the largest of the islands, was visited by ships sailing to the Indies in former times. The 'blue island' of Faial is home to a vast caldeira bordered by lush vegetation made up of hydrangea, cedars, beech trees, mosses and juniper bushes. Lajes do Pico, a small former whaling town, has strong historical associations with the Atlantic explorers.

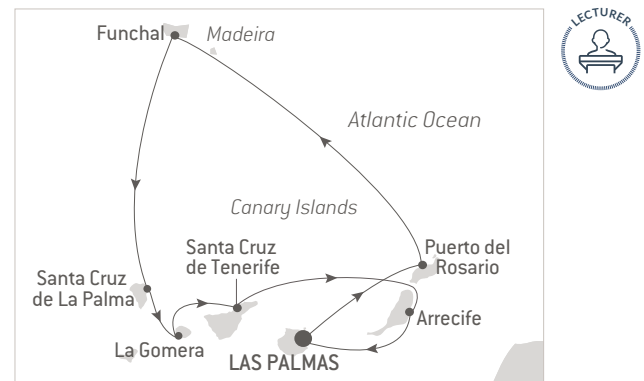

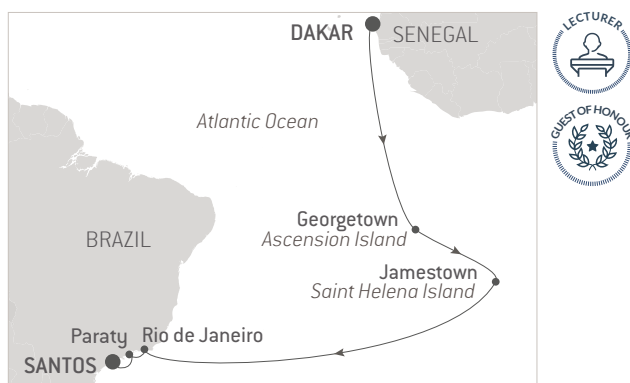

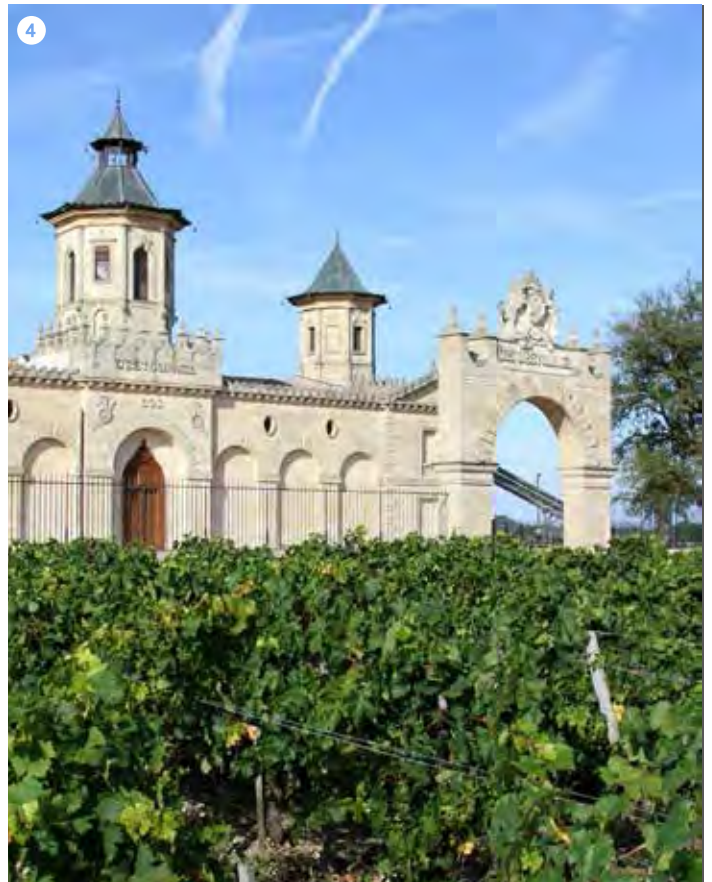

# *The Mediterranean*

From this 'sea between lands', stories, cultures, panoramas and gastronomy have all emerged, accompanied by hospitality and human warmth: an eternal source to which one readily returns, with the greatest pleasure.



# Not to be missed

The Mediterranean is all about the unique light, the vibrant colours. It is the golden sun that colours the skin. It is the air laden with sea spray, the woody scent of pine trees, the mellow fragrance of citrus blossom, the subtle taste of olive oil. It is the lapping of the waves, the song of the cicada. And it's also the history of numerous civilisations, a cultural melting pot and an entire lifestyle. It's a whole world in itself.



## The cradle of numerous civilisations

By connecting its peoples in multiple ways, the Mediterranean basin has brought cultures together and created civilisations renowned for their philosophers, artists, writers and scientists. We simply cannot imagine the world's history without the many contributions from the Egyptian, Greek, Roman and Ottoman eras. Our oldest heritage is marked with their legacy: Rome with its Forum and Colosseum; the ancient city of Pompeii preserved in ashes; Athens, the heart of Ancient Greece; the pyramids and the Sphinx of Giza; the dynastic temple of Karnak; the fortress of Masada perched in the Judean desert; the pink city of Petra carved in the rock. And that is just a tiny sample of the sublime remains that have survived the ages.

## Easy living and beautiful blues

In the Mediterranean, the warm, sunny climate makes for a diverse abundance of plant life. There are pine forests, maquis, vineyards, fields of cereals, olive trees, citrus groves, plus thousands of plants and flowers. In this multifaceted region, the landscapes change with the seasons, the geology, and the fauna and flora. In Corsica, the limestone cliffs of Bonifacio are sculpted by the wind and the waves. In Malta, the island of Comino offers secluded coves bathed in crystal-clear water. A few miles out of Naples, the lava flows from the last eruption of Vesuvius in 1944 can still be seen. But over and over again, our gaze is drawn to the blue of the sky or of the sea.

## The mix of cultures

Shaped by their centuries-long history and their openness to the world, the great Mediterranean cities are a blend of remembrance, abandonment, and a formidable capacity for resilience. These historic cities have had to change with the times, successively recreating their urban landscapes and their aura. Festive Barcelona harbours secular gothic architecture alongside modern and surrealist works by artists such as Gaudí and Miro. Cosmopolitan Istanbul is embodied in Hagia Sophia, Topkapı Palace, the backstreets of the Galata district, the emblematic Beyoğlu or Ortaköy districts and their artists, designers, avant-garde chefs. Bustling Lisbon boasts the Belém district, with its 17th-century tower and the Hieronymites monastery, standing side by side the futuristic Parque das Nações (Park of Nations).





## Things to see, do and experience

- ✓ **The medieval citadel of Bonifacio**, set on a limestone cliff, with its cobbled streets, parapet walk and staircase carved in the rock.
- ✓ **The delicious churros** to be sampled on the Plaza de los Naranjos before a tour of Nuestra Señora de la Encarnacion church in Marbella, on the Costa del Sol.
- ✓ **The Ancient Greek theatre of Taormina**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, with its spectacular view of the sea and Mount Etna in the background.
- ✓ **The *Gallotia galloti* lizard**, a species found only on the islands of Tenerife and La Palma, which you may be lucky enough to spot.
- ✓ **The Corinthian Canal**, with its narrow strip of water, only accessible to ships with a draught of less than eight metres.
- ✓ **La Pedamentina**, a scenic walkway including some 414 steps and offering a sweeping view of Naples and its Gulf.



# Ports of call and places to explore



**Through the eyes of Héloïse Mas**  
*The Mediterranean, the cradle of lyrical art*

In the course of her young career, the lyric mezzo-soprano Héloïse Mas has performed on numerous stages, notably in cities around the Mediterranean such as Nice, Marseille and Monte Carlo. This region, the cradle of lyrical art, is particularly close to her heart.

"Lyrical art is alive and well in the Mediterranean because it has always been supported by artists who are keen to defend it. Composers used to travel frequently from one country to another and there were many cultural exchanges within the Mediterranean basin. Lyrical art has therefore been easily shared over time. It is extraordinary music, you cannot remain insensitive to it. It never leaves you indifferent. I decided to become an opera singer because I wanted to express myself and share the emotions of music. No matter where I perform, whether it's in a closed hall, on a boat [editor's note: Héloïse Mas will be performing at the *2nd Lyric Festival at Sea* in alliance with Radio Classique

during the October 1, 2023 cruise aboard *Le Lyrial*] or in an antique theatre like the one in Orange, I love sharing this passion with my audience. It is always very powerful to sing in an arena because these are mythical stages, full of history. I have a strong relationship with the Mediterranean because my father is Spanish. I have a lot of family in Spain, on the Costa Blanca, south of Valencia, down towards Alicante. Many of my childhood memories are linked to this region. As soon as I return to the Mediterranean coast, I feel rejuvenated. I associate Spain and the Mediterranean beaches with smells and the wind. The air has a very particular smell even if it is not the same in Spain as in Nice."

## The Cyclades, lands of myths

Often mountainous, these 250 islands (24 of which are inhabited) boast idyllic coastal views. However, they also testify to cultural wealth rooted in the beliefs of the ancient Greeks: the Cyclades are nymphs who were turned into rocks by Poseidon after they provoked his ire. They owe their name to the circle – *kyklos* – that they form around the sacred island of Delos. The latter is now an uninhabited open-air museum, and is said to be the birthplace of Apollo and Artemis, born of Zeus's infidelities. Like the god or mythical character to whom it refers, each island has its own unique characteristics and its own magnificent treasures to be explored.





## Fiery Sicily

Sicily and its islands have been subject to various land movements that have constantly reshaped their horizons. The landscapes are lunar, at times grey or black, at others green or yellow, often smoky, sometimes glowing. Bordered by the sea and the mountains, Etna, one of the most active volcanoes in Europe, repeatedly unleashed its fury on Catania. The town has been rebuilt seven times. The Aeolian Islands are home to a remarkable icon: Stromboli, the beacon of the Mediterranean, still active with its island formed by lava flows. The fertile volcanic soil is ideal for vine and citrus growing.



## *Dolce Vita* on the Amalfi Coast

Tucked away between the Gulf of Salerno and the Gulf of Naples, the Amalfi Coast is an ode to the art of living. No one can resist its charms: enjoy strolling through the shady narrow streets around a century-old square, or sit on a terrace for an aperitivo with a breathtaking view of the sunset. Or you can sip on a glass of limoncello, made from the nectar of lemons, the region's emblematic crop cultivated on steep terraces. From the white of Amalfi to the brightly coloured houses of Positano, the villages and roads are like gems, embedded in the rocky cliffs. They form backdrops worthy of the most beautiful Italian cinema productions in which you would see Sophia Loren, Claudia Cardinale or Marcello Mastroianni holidaying in the sun.



## Age-old farming traditions in Stari Grad

The island of Hvar in Croatia is home to the country's oldest town, Stari Grad. Colonised by the Greeks in the 4th century B.C., the fertile plain that bears its name illustrates an exemplary system of agricultural layout, divided into plots with rainwater collection. Thanks to this system, vines and olives have been grown here continuously for 2,400 years. A UNESCO World Heritage site, the plain can be explored on foot or on bicycle following the vineyard trails. As you go along, you'll come across archaeological sites dating back to the time of the first Greek settlers, such as the ruins of a watchtower or a Roman house.



## Comino, Malta's wild pearl

There is a place, somewhere in the Mediterranean, that bears an uncanny resemblance to a Polynesian lagoon. To the far north of Malta, a sprinkling of islands bathe in the crystal-clear waters that alternate between shades of turquoise and emerald. Well known for its Blue Lagoon beach lined with white sand and a paradise for diving and snorkelling, Comino easily rivals with the coastal destinations of the Pacific. Its arid land is used to grow cumin — hence its name — alongside olives, fig, tamarisk, pine and acacia.

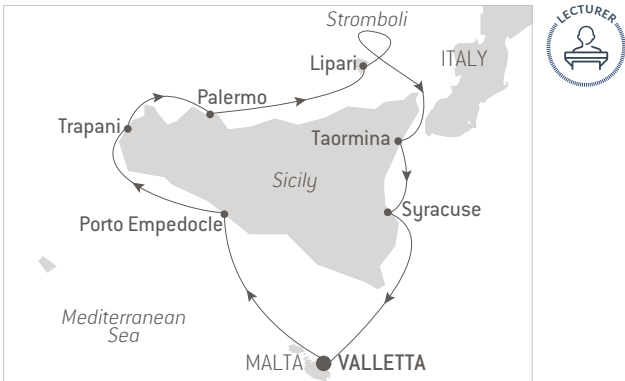

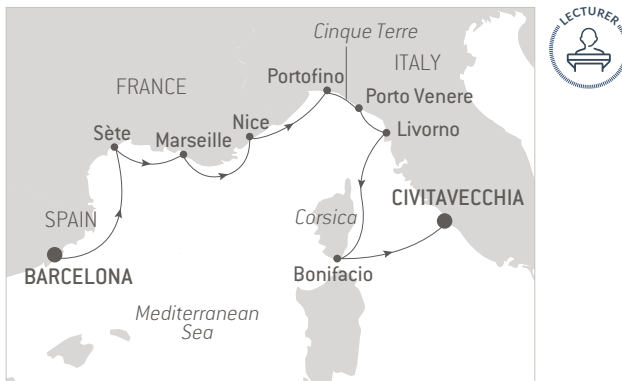

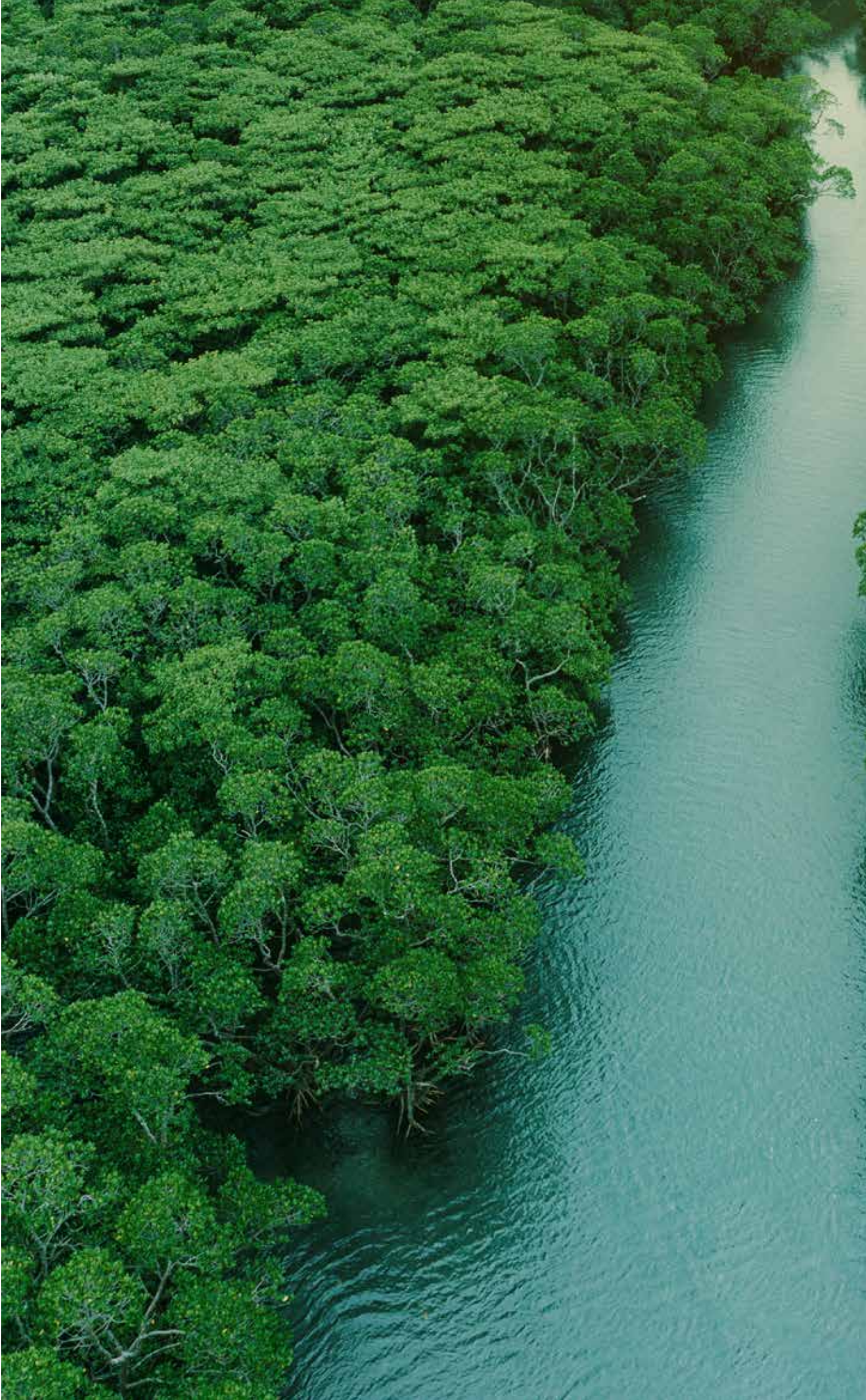

The intoxicating scent of the tiaré flower of Polynesia, the wide-open spaces and Horizontal Falls of Australia, the ancient temples, the Japanese desert: these are just some of the many treasures the Pacific has to offer. A veritable plunge into history, landscapes and ancestral traditions.



## Japan, a surprisingly unexpected archipelago

A country balanced between unrestrained modernity and still deeply rooted ancestral traditions, the “Land of the Rising Sun” is brimming with unfamiliar and little-explored treasures. Far from the ultra-connected megalopolises normally representative of modern Japan, unusual idyllic landscapes reach out to welcome travellers, off the beaten track. From a sandy desert reminiscent of the Sahara to traditional little fishing villages, an exotic and otherworldly sense of a complete change of scenery is guaranteed.

At the extreme south of the country's 3,900 islets and four main islands lies the Okinawa archipelago, a place of white sandy beaches and a subtropical climate. Timeless and thousands of years old, Japan is a multifaceted country of enchanting, unexpected beauty.

## Kimberley, Australia in its raw state

Australia's last remaining unspoiled space, the Kimberley region is a wild and untamed destination unlike any other. Its unspoiled scenery testifies to the geological wonders of our planet and its ability to create extraordinary places and phenomena. Amongst them, the Horizontal Falls – original, to say the least, and unique in the world. Surrounded by a beautiful gorge with variable colours and textures and fed by wet season run-off, King George twin falls, the highest single-drop falls in the whole of the Kimberley, display a changing scenery that is nothing short of breathtaking. Abundant biodiversity and wildlife, vast, arid expanses and rivers flowing through impressive gorges combine to form ochre and ruby coloured panoramic scenery that is simply not to be missed.

## Polynesia, the paradise at the end of the world

An earthly paradise lying isolated out in the middle of the Pacific, the atolls of Polynesia evoke idyllic, almost imaginary landscapes. Tahiti and its lagoons are the very embodiment of this, enchanting all who venture there. Under the tropical winds, the blue shades of the ocean extend as far as the eye can see, its waves breaking on beaches lined with coconut palms. Rich and frenetic, the underwater wildlife of the atolls offers the delightful spectacle of hundreds of brightly coloured fish around your feet in the water, surrounded by the beauty of the coral reefs.

If you want to explore the lush vegetation of the ancient volcanoes, simply head off on a hike along the wild, steep trails. Welcome to a dream from which you won't want awake.





## *Things to see, do and experience*

- ✓ **Montgomery, the world's largest reef**, lying 130 kilometres off the coast of Australia and renowned for its impressive tidal movements.
- ✓ **The mysterious ancient caves of Kimberley**, filled with rock paintings created by the Aborigines who lived there in former times.
- ✓ **The Tuamotu sandpiper**, a small bird endemic to the region and that inhabits the Fakarava atoll.
- ✓ **The blue or pearly-white tinged cultured pearl** harvested only in the lagoons of Polynesia.
- ✓ **Samurai culture**, of which the south of the island of Honshū, with its perfectly preserved former warriors' houses, is the birthplace.
- ✓ **Japan's longest waterfalls and the primal forest of Bijodaira**, which spreads out along the entire Tateyama Kurobe Alpine Route.
- ✓ The very rare species native to Iriomote-Ishigaki National Park, such as the **Iriomote cat** and the **crested serpent eagle**.

# Ports of call and places to explore



## Through the eyes of Mick Fogg *The Kimberley, a last great wilderness area*

For 20 years, Australian Mick Fogg, renowned photographer and Director of PONANT expeditions for Asia-Pacific, has been telling the secrets and revealing the splendours of the Kimberley to travellers. A fascinating area, home of the oldest continuing culture on earth.

“Australia’s Kimberley coast has a magnetic effect. Born by fire over two billion years ago, it is a wild land of remote, spectacular scenery spread over vast distances. The wide open plains and rugged red sandstone gorges are quintessentially Australia and like nowhere else on earth. Often referred to as the ‘Antarctica of the Tropics’, it’s the pristine environment, astounding scale and remoteness that give rise to the comparison. The sheer size and age of the landscape is humbling, and I feel privileged to experience such an untouched environment that has so many facets. It is home to the oldest continuous culture on earth, the world’s largest living reptile, the only two ‘Horizontal Falls’ on the planet, the world’s largest inshore reef and the largest

population of migrating humpback whales on the planet. Here you can also find the greatest collection of outdoor galleries in the world, with more than a million sites revealing First Nations Peoples’ rock art heritage. Today we know that the most ancient of rock art styles, *Gwion Gwion*, is a minimum of 12,000 years old and as the dating technology improves it continues to reveal paintings of an even earlier origin. From ancient landscapes, ancient cultures and ancient reptiles to spectacular scenery, unique tidal phenomena and amazing wildlife, a Kimberley coast expedition has something for even the most ardent traveller. It is a destination that everyone should experience at least once in their lifetime!”

## The secrets of the island of Huahine

Lying in an isolated location in the middle of the Pacific, Huahine feels like an island at the end of the world. Its 74 square kilometres are made up of two small islands linked by a bridge: Big Huahine to the north and Little Huahine to the south. Amidst the wild vegetation and small, hidden-away coves are *marae* to explore, very well-preserved sacred sites constructed from volcanic rock and coral. The handful of fishing villages by the coast offer wonderful opportunities to learn about local ancestral traditions, such as the ‘fish parks’ for example (a primitive form of aquaculture), thus giving you the opportunity to sample the traditional simplicity and authenticity of one of Polynesia’s most beautiful islands.







## Tottori, the unexpected desert

Did you know that there is a sand desert in Japan? Both surprising and magnificent, the dunes of Tottori extend along the coast of the Sea of Japan for more than 16 kilometres and reach a maximum height of 47 metres. These natural curiosities are the result of marine currents and winds depositing volcanic sediment from the Sendai River on the coast. Sandboarding, paragliding and horse or camel trekking offer particularly fun ways to explore this unusual and atypical environment and its scenery. Be sure to visit the Sand Museum near the dunes, where there are huge sculptures made entirely from sand and unlike anything else in the world on display!



## Timeless world of the Seto Inland Sea

The oldest maritime route in Japan and a strategic crossroads during ancient times, this region draws its entire history and riches from the sea. Certain of the perfectly preserved traditional houses encountered when wandering the winding streets of the port town of Mitarai are more than 200 years old. A little further on, fishermen can be seen sorting fish caught very early the same morning. The iconic bright red Daidō-era temples in Onomichi, such as those of Senkō-ji and Jōdō-ji, are as ancient as they are emotionally impactful and affecting. And finally, if the gentle way of life of Tomonoura seems familiar to you, it's perhaps because the town served as the inspiration for the animated film *Ponyo* by artist Hayao Miyazaki.



## The secular arts of the Marquesas Islands

The centuries go by, and the traditional arts of the Marquesas archipelago continue to be passed from generation to generation. Famous across the whole of Polynesia for their many traditional skills, the Marquesans tell local stories and legends by sculpting wood, stone and bone, or by drawing on skin. An ancient and methodically systematic art, *maori* or Polynesian tattooing is where the word tattoo actually comes from. Those who enjoy crafts can try their hand at making seed necklaces or fabricating and dyeing tapa, a cloth made from wood fibre. And finally, when it comes to living to the sensual and colourful rhythm of the archipelago, what could be more quintessentially authentic than creating your very own *kumu hei*, the bouquet of love.

## A tropical cocktail in Japan

Turquoise waters, white sand and coconut palms... No, you are not dreaming! You really are on the islands of Kikaijima and Kumejima in Japan. Known as the 'Island of Centenarians', Okinawa is actually an archipelago located in the far south of Japan, between the East China Sea and the Pacific Ocean. A haven of peace with a subtropical climate, Okinawa is strongly associated with the history of the Second World War. Its local culture subtly blends Chinese, Indonesian and Polynesian influences to adapt them to Japanese rituals. The magnificent and harmoniously curving hills of Iriomote-Ishigaki National Park offer the tantalising prospect of unforgettable onshore excursions.

Hidden in the many caves and grottos of this ancient landscape are a multitude of ancient Rock Art galleries. Here you can find spectacular examples of the Wandjina and Gwion Gwion styles.

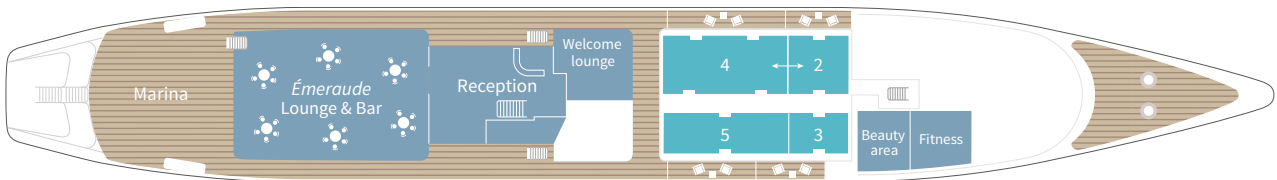

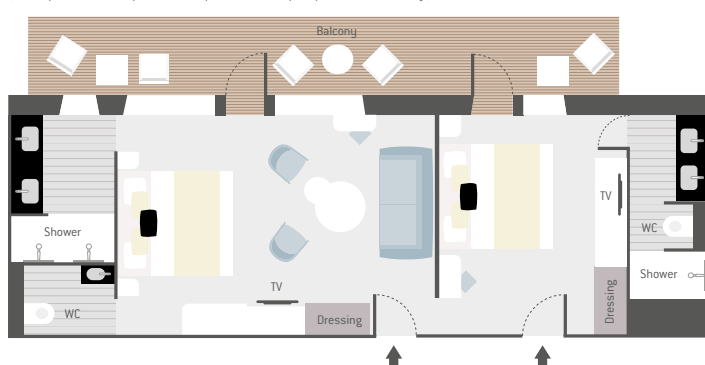

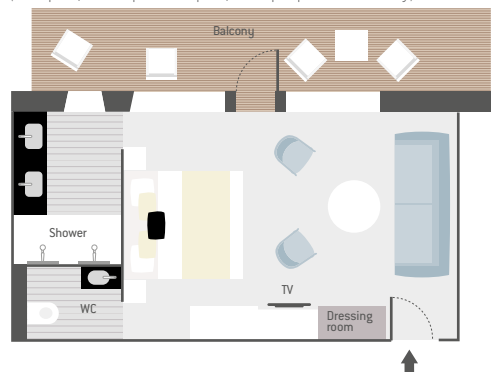

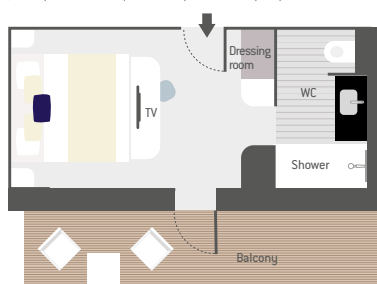

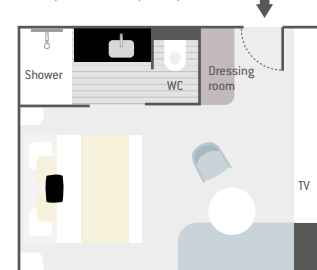

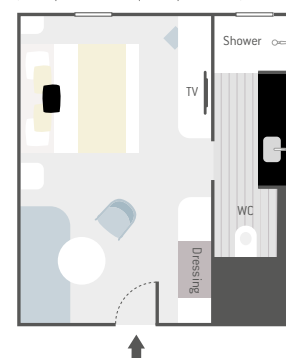

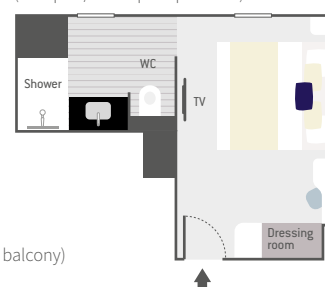

# Formalities

## FOR ALL CRUISES

The information below is current but subject to change at any time without advance notice from government authorities. Please consult your respective government agencies for visa and health information.

The identity card valid for three (3) months after the end of your stay is sufficient to travel within the Schengen area. Passport valid for at least six (6) months beyond the completion of your trip. Passport must contain at least two completely clear, blank, unused visa pages for each visa required, not including any amendment pages. Visa pages with stains or ink from other pages in the passport are not usable. Guests who deviate from the scheduled embarkation or disembarkation port should research the foreign entry requirements for the port country. Due to government regulations, regrettably, Ponant will have to deny boarding to any guest who fails to obtain the appropriate travel documentation for this trip.

Before departure, a medical questionnaire will be sent to you by e-mail. You will be asked to return it duly completed 45 days before the start of your cruise.

(2) **Canada:** entry (or transit) by air - The ETA is required for Australian and British citizens, US citizens are exempt. Other nationalities, please contact Canada consulate website for details. <http://www.canada.ca/en/index.html>. A copy of your visa or ETA must be sent to PONANT at the very latest 45 days prior to your cruise date. In case the ETA is sufficient to enter Canada, we also ask you to keep a copy of your ETA with your passport throughout the duration of your trip.

(3) **Canada:** travel by sea - The eTA is not required for US, Australian and British citizens. Other nationalities: a Visa may be required, please contact Canada consulate website for details. <http://www.canada.ca/en/index.html>

(4) Please note that for polar plunge and ice floating, an EKG (electrocardiogram) by your general practitioner in addition to the PONANT medical questionnaire will be required.

Also, for persons under 18 wishing to take part in these activities as well as kayaking, a sworn statement from the parents or legal guardians that they are able to swim will be asked. A parent or legal guardian must be present at the time of the activity.

You must be able to produce evidence (written in English) of holding comprehensive medical insurance including repatriation.

(2) **Egypt:** Visa delivered and charged onboard (25€ to date subject to change). This visa is valid for 30 days.

(3) **Jordan:** a visa is mandatory (current cost 40 JOD). The visa is included for guests participating in a PONANT pre or post-cruise programme. In order to secure your visa, please send a copy of your passport to PONANT 30 days prior to your cruise departure.

The validity of those visas are restricted to the duration of PONANT pre and post cruise programs. Groups of tourists visiting Jordan for a minimum stay of 2 consecutive nights and arriving through Amman Airport, whose programme has been organised by a Jordanian agency, benefit of a complimentary visa on condition that they are met by the local Jordanian agency at the airport. Please note that rules and regulations regarding visa subject to change by the government without any prior notice. Guests not participating on PONANT pre or post cruise programs will have to pay for the visa at the arrival or departure airport. Double entry visas can be obtained prior to the cruise and have a validity of 3 months.

**Australia:** an Electronic Travel Authority (ETA) must be obtained before your arrival in Australia. Carriers should be aware that there will not be any physical evidence in your passport. A copy of your ETA must be sent to PONANT at the latest 45 days prior to your cruise date.

We also ask you to keep a copy of your ETA and keep it with your passport throughout the duration of your trip.

Australian customs regulations are very strict, especially for the import of food items such as fresh food (even sealed), fruits, eggs, meat, plants, vegetables, seeds, grains. Fur and feathers are also forbidden. ## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### Visas:

Before departure, please check carefully that your visas are valid for the right date and time spent in the countries in order to avoid unpleasant situations.

### Warning about the use of drones:

The use of drones aboard PONANT ships, whether they are sailing at sea, at a port of call or anchored, is strictly forbidden. The use of drones on land in the Arctic and Antarctic regions is also strictly forbidden by international polar regulations. In other regions, it may be possible to use drones on land if

permission has been obtained from the relevant authorities of each country and each region travelled through, as well as a pilot's licence that should be obtained from your home country. Passengers are responsible for obtaining these permits; they should be able to present them at all times. Passengers who do not obtain these authorizations expose themselves to the risk of legal proceeding.

### Medication:

If you have a medical treatment, do not forget your prescription.



## POLAR EXPEDITION CRUISE

- Complimentary polar parka: For all cruises marked with the logo "parka gift", a PONANT polar water-resistant parka is offered (adult sizes only - in case of consecutive cruises, only one parka per person).
- Complimentary boots hire: Boot rental will be offered onboard (for adults only) on Expedition cruises where the logo "Free Boot Rental" appears.
- Ports of call, visited sites, outings and landings will depend on weather conditions, position of ice, winds and the state of the sea. These can force a change of plans at any time. The Captain and the Expedition Leader may at any time cancel or stop any activity, or even modify the itinerary. The final itinerary will be confirmed by the Captain, who will take into account

the touristic quality of the sites and above all, the safety of the passengers. His decision will be based on advice from experts and authorities.

- Travelling to polar/isolated regions is an exhilarating experience in remote areas: please remember that you are far from modern hospitals with full medical facilities, thus evacuation is extremely expensive. Without adequate medical coverage, all expenses will have to be immediately paid with your personal funds. We urge you to subscribe to full coverage insurance, choose your insurance company very carefully, be extremely vigilant and ensure your insurance is fully comprehensive, especially if you are insured by your credit card. PONANT offers an insurance contract with extensive guarantees, please contact us for more information.



## FOR CRUISES OFFERING SCUBA DIVING

Passengers may take part in scuba diving activities, providing certain conditions are respected, in line with the applicable health, scientific and medical conditions in force on the day of the dive.

Passengers who wish to scuba dive are required to provide the onboard diving monitor with a valid medical certificate authorising them to scuba dive, as well as their certification card and their up-to-date dive log. Within the context of the health measures relating to Covid-19, you will also be required to complete a health declaration. You will be given this form when you pre-book your dive.

For yachting cruises, The minimum level required for scuba diving is 1 star CMAS or the PADI Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months)

must be presented at the beginning of the cruise to our main diving instructor.

For expedition cruises, The minimum level required for scuba diving is 2 star CMAS or the PADI Advanced Open Water Diver (or equivalent). The certification card, the diving log book and a recent medical certificate (less than 12 months) must be presented at the beginning of the cruise to our main diving instructor.

Process of the dives (certified divers): Mask and snorkel: for health reasons due to Covid-19, we strongly recommend that you come on board with your own mask and snorkel. As an exception, you will be able to borrow them in accordance with sanitary conditions.



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
